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1. Introduction

1.1 Purpose

This document highlights the new features and enhancements that have been implemented in this Microsoft Dynamics 365 for Operations, release 10.0.17.10 of Government Contracting. This release is compatible with Microsoft Dynamics 365 for Operations, v 10.0.17.

Please note: GovCon 10.0.10.8 is pre-requisite to uptake MS 10.0.11 or higher.

This document is intended for partners and customers using Government Contracting (GovCon) on Dynamics 365.

6. Best Practice issues

6.1 Standard D365 best practice issues

As part of Release Notes for Government Contracting for Microsoft Dynamics 365 for Operations release, we encountered known best practice (BP) issues. The list of known BP issues can be found as part of the installer.

The BP issues are minor and have no impact on the behaviour of the application, therefore can be ignored. All known BP issues are added to the macro (SysIgnoreBPChecklist); hence, they are not shown and do not impact customer customizations.

6.2 LCS best practice issues

We have executed the LCS best practice test for our solution and encountered known best practice (BP) issues. The majority of the BP issues cannot be resolved due to architecture design. LCS BP issues have no impact on the behaviour of the application therefore, they can be ignored.
